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Safety Protocol

Safety Features in place at NUI

- Ionization HVAC school wide system to purify the air.
- Masking required
- Temperature checks required
- Physical distancing
- Limited mixing of groups
- Staff required to vaccinate or submit weekly COVID test
- Before arriving to school, parents must use the Daily Health Check questions to assess if their child can attend school that day.
- Students are wearing their masks when they are dropped off.
- Students will have a temperature check before entering their homeroom.
- Students will sanitize hands before entering their homeroom.
- Students will be seated 3 feet apart. There will be limited movement.
- Students will use individual supplies, no community or shared supplies.

DAILY HEALTH CHECK

It is the responsibility of each family to ensure that the daily health check is followed every day for every child. We are responsible for protecting ourselves and protecting others.

Has your child had any signs or symptoms of a fever in the past 24 hours such as chills, sweats, felt feverish or had a temperature that is elevated than normal or 100F or greater? If YES, keep your child home. *

Has your family traveled internationally or outside of the State of New Jersey in the last 14 days? (excluding Pennsylvania and New York) If YES, keep your child home. *

Are you or your child currently waiting on the results of a COVID-19 test? If YES, keep your child home. *

Within the last 14 days, has your family been exposed to, or come into contact with: If YES to any of the following, keep your child home.

- anyone who has COVID-19**
- who is/was being tested for COVID-19**
- who had symptoms consistent with COVID-19**
- who was exposed to someone with COVID- 19 ***

Has your child had any of the following symptoms in the past 48 hours? If YES to any of these symptoms, keep your child home.

Fever or Chills, Cough, Shortness of Breath, Difficulty Breathing, Fatigue, Muscle Aches, Body aches, Headache, Loss of Taste or Smell, Sore Throat, Congestion, Runny Nose, Nausea or Vomiting, Diarrhea *

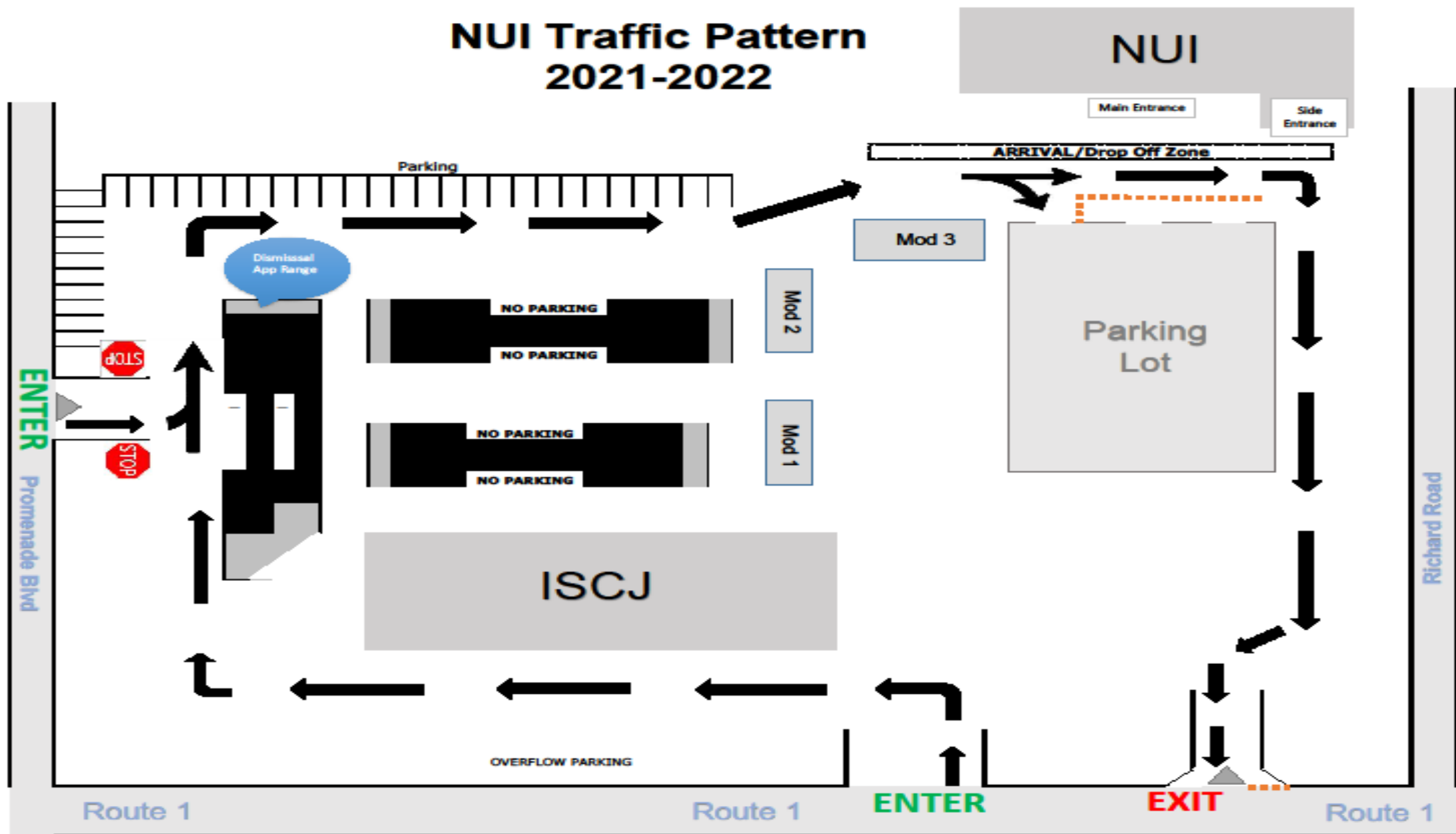
Safety Protocol

- Space between students will be doubled (about 6 feet apart) when eating and removing masks.
 - Half the class will go outside and half will eat inside or some other accommodation based on circumstances.
- Students will have gym outside when possible or in the ISCJ MPR. There may be times when they will need to remain in classes and during those occasions, masks will remain on.
- Students will be physically distanced in hallways and monitored to limit number of students in bathrooms.
- Travel quarantine is required for anyone traveling outside the tristate area. 14 days from day of return if the individual is not vaccinated; 10 days from return if a COVID test is done 3-5 days after travel and it is negative. Vaccinated individuals will have to test 3-5 days after return and can return to school with a negative test.
- Any student displaying symptoms similar to COVID symptoms will be sent to clinic and picked up by parents and can only return with a negative test.
- Parents and staff will be notified if they are considered a close contact in any positive or suspected positive case.

Safer Dismissal Process

- Observe COVID protocols and distancing
- Students in classrooms
- Better safety on how students maneuver around campus
- Dismiss from classroom instead of Lobby

Two-step process daily

- Families will have hang tags with a number for the family.
- Entry Admin outside sees cars & enters hang tag numbers into the system
- System Alerts teachers to release students from classroom
- Exit Admin confirms release to parent in the system
